Within each priority area there is a clear action plan so that the desired outcome is achievable and sustainable. This incorporates a range of actions such as training, resources, teaching and learning, monitoring and evaluation tools. We support staff through INSET

training sessions to update on new initiatives and continue to undertake training throughout the school year to support professional development and strengthen expertise.
