### **Children &** Young People

### Our priorities for children and young people are:

- Expand our current educational offer by opening new schools across the East Midlands.
- Ensure all students leaving school are supported to have a positive outcome destination, where we start preparing for the next steps in life at an earlier age.
  - Offer a place to live that meets their autism needs.
  - Provide a short breaks service so young people and their families get a break and can enjoy time apart.

### Young People Becoming Adults

We will be establishing a new Transitions Team that supports young people from age 16 to 25.

This support would start in our schools and our staff would work with our young people to help them prepare for adulthood and help them reach their desired destinations for their next steps in life.



## Working Age Adults

Our priorities for working age adults are:

- Develop a range of living solutions to meet the developing needs of our residents and others.
- Develop our short breaks
  offer, enabling adults more
  opportunities to experience
  a change of environment.
- Improve the employment rate amongst autistic people by establishing a Social Enterprise that provides paid employment for autistic adults.
- Offer apprenticeships within AEM that are reserved for autistic employees.



### **Older Adults**

#### **Our priorities for older adults are:**

- Develop our understanding of the future needs of older service users, by ensuring all adults have a person-centred review.
- Ensure older adults in our care have access to appropriate accommodation that supports their needs.
- Enable older adults to have access to a range of activities that support their interests.
