We also have a sensory element to the service offering lots of sensory activities, through music and sensory exploring. Our building is an easy to access building which has generously spacious rooms. We have a unique approach to supporting adults with Autism and Learning disabilities; the nature of our service encourages the individual as much choice and control over their support which is always approached in a person centred way. We are located on an industrial park in Mansfield Woodhouse which reflects the purpose of our work based activities and opportunities.

Our experienced supporting staff team will develop a bespoke programme of activities, tailored to individual needs and aspirations, within a structured and supportive environment.
