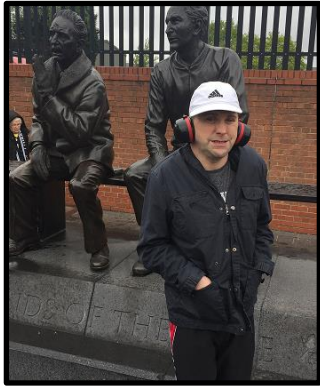


# Carlton Road News...

Grimsby Town! Mark has been to see Nott's County before, and this time he had a great experience watching

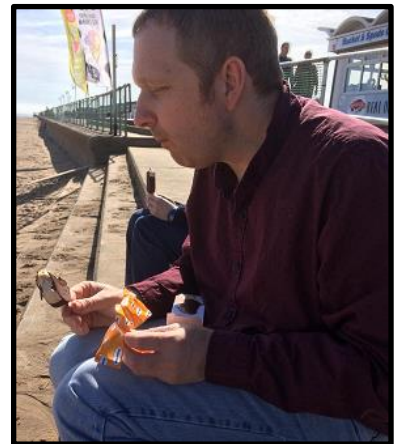
Nott's score two goals against

back at the pitch again.

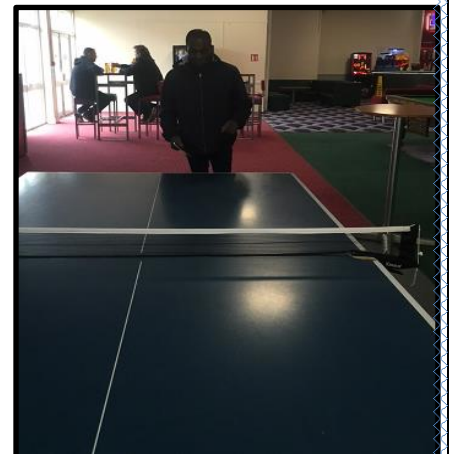
